Not many people know that our full name is The King's Fold Retreat and *Renewal* Centre, but we have been living into that name since our inception. Miriam Webster defines renewal as "the state of being made new, fresh, or strong again" and we can testify to the truth of that being experienced by our guests... and "Your love and care our facility."

Many of our guests make time for a personal retreat when they are in seasons of challenge, loss, transition, or grief. Time spent in the beauty of Gods creation, in quiet reflection, and in openness to God provides an opportunity to transition from *what has been* to *what might be*. We as a community journey alongside our guests, providing meals, companionship, and a listening ear, as they are made new, fresh, and strong again through God's power at work.

Groups that book King's Fold for their retreats have similar outcomes, because naturally, these groups are comprised of *individuals*. Each person has an opportunity to experience and press into God's arms of love. In June, we hosted 12 Pastors and 5 Spiritual Directors from the Evangelical Covenant Church in the USA for a six-day retreat. Observing the

We are delighted to celebrate that God has given to our facilities what he has given to our guests, *the state of being made new, fresh, or strong again.*

Thank you for the part you play in the success of King's Fold, whether it be as guest, volunteer, donor, or prayer partner. We are stronger because of your support. As we enter a future that only God knows, we ask for your continued prayers for our Board and our Community, and for the guests who arrive at our doors seeking

GETTING TO KNOW THE COMMUNITY - TERRY DYKSTRA

Continuing with the tradition of giving a more thorough introduction of each Community member in our newsletter, we would like you to get to know Terry Dykstra. Terry began working at King's Fold in April 2016, after working for 27 years in the technology sector in downtown Calgary. Even though he's still King's Fold's *I.T. Specialist* his primary role when he is not making or serving meals is in Facilities Maintenance.

Terry was born in Sarnia, ON to parents who had moved from Holland to Canada for his father's work in the chemical sector. At age three, his family moved to Belgium, and then at age eight, to Holland. Terry met Alicia in a college fellowship group, and their love for recreation, nature, music, adventure, and each other led to a marriage that has lasted for 34 years. This past spring they were able to fulfill a lifelong wish of visiting Taizé, France, partially in preparation for leading a Taizé-style retreat in September. Terry and Alicia have three adult children who live in the Calgary area.



Terry attended First Baptist Church in Calgary for 27 years, and sang in the choir all that time. He volunteered in a variety of service and leadership positions, including teaching ESL and Bible studies, serving as deacon, and as Chair of the church council. He and Alicia currently attend All Saints Anglican in Cochrane, where they're involved in leading worship.

Terry's passions include woodworking and music... especially guitar. He has been a part-time student at Carey Theological College and graduated this year with a Certificate in Ministry. His various skills have made him a valuable asset to our Community, as he can fix a computer, create a routered sign, write new software, or install a plumbing line. Terry is a standout in the kitchen, and is a wonderful, compassionate listener to our guests. He calls himself the "Town Crier" because he will be one of the first in the community to cry in sensitive situations. We love his tender heart, and the unique role he plays in the Community. This has been a challenging year for Terry, as Alicia was diagnosed with cancer in November 2018 and has needed surgery, radiation, and several rounds of chemo to achieve the best possible health outcomes. Despite that, he has courageously modelled hope and joy in challenging circumstances.

COMMUNITY NEWS

The resident Community has been under growing pressure to expand in size, as usage of our facility grows each year. Randy and Kim Wiens were the last to join our community in September 2017, and have slowly transitioned to living here full time. Randy and Kim sold their home in Calgary, and moved on site in April. They are celebrating the end of a long season of commuting.

In the first 6 months of 2019, there was a 20% growth in retreat revenues compared to 2018. This came in a season where multiple staff have had extended absences for medical reasons, including surgery and cancer



treatments. Because of decreased staff capacity and increased usage, it has been hard for us to find time for those tasks outside our regular kitchen and housekeeping routines. However, in October we were delighted to invite Teresa Smith to become the 10th member of our community. Teresa served the last 6 years as Food Services Manager at Pioneer Camp, in Rocky Mountain House. Welcome Teresa! Another community member who joined us this year has brought abundant energy, pure extrovert-ism and unequalled enthusiasm. Leila - a Golden Retriever/Standard Poodle cross, joined us in May. She has brought new life (not to mention new invitations for patience!) to Cooper, Rocky, and the rest of the community. © We love her.

SEASON OF UPGRADES CONTINUES AT KING'S FOLD

In 2016 and 2017, funds raised during the "Place matters" campaign were used to complete numerous upgrades including new shingles, windows, and stairs for the lodge. Last summer we completed our most ambitious renovations in recent history with more than \$100,000 spent renovating and furnishing the main floor guest rooms, building a wooden walkway, creating a circle drive at the main entrance, replacing siding damaged by woodpeckers, and removing some Spruce trees to enhance fire safety.

Due to the continuing generosity of individuals, foundations, and companies, this summer we were once again able to close for three weeks to complete the renovations on seven remaining guest rooms. Rooms 8-14 were sound insulated, dry walled, painted, carpeted, and had showers, tubs, lino, and bathroom fixtures replaced where needed. Room by room new furniture is being added as time and space allow.

We also tackled a large-scale replacement of siding on the prayer tower and on two sides of the south facing dining room exterior. Woodpecker activity has damaged our cedar siding, and we need to replace as much as we can each year, as funds allow. We are replacing the cedar with a colour matched cement board siding, which is bird, insect, hail, and fire resistant... and it looks terrific! When we replaced the prayer tower siding we also built a porch roof over the previously unprotected lower entrance.

As in previous years, we could not have completed these projects without the support of many volunteers, as well as businesses who donated or discounted services and materials. 
CHRISTMAS OPEN HOUSE - Sunday, DECEMBER 1, from 2:00 - 4:00 pm
